2.2 Club Affiliation

For Decision

In Board Meeting #15 on August 8th, the Board was asked to confirm the affiliation to Te Tira Ahu Pae of the 24 listed clubs (attached). This would bring our total affiliated clubs to 88 clubs. Affiliation is to be ongoing, provided a compliant affiliation application is provided to TTAP by the renewal date of 30 April each year, and provided no recommendation has been received that they be disaffiliated.

The Board asked to table this decision for a later meeting until Young Nats, Massey Gaming Club, and the Hunting and Fishing Club had been investigated. Ryan has investigated and provided the following information on these clubs:

Young Nats

- The aims and goals of Young Nats is to provide a safe social space for like-minded young centre-right students to engage with one another to further their interest in politics and the National Party. In doing so, members will gain opportunities to engage with Young Nats, National Party MPs and Ministers. This will be done by creating, informing and providing events and engagements for members.
- They have external affiliations to the NZ Young Nats, as well as the LNI Young Nats. They
 remain independent from these groups in their operations and have a committee of current
 students who are leading the club.
- Grants are only to be used for the direct benefit of MU students. Attached is the grant procedure that outlines this. The types of events and activities the club intended to run involved networking activities for students and MPs, visits to Parliament, and generally providing social spaces for students to learn more about and discuss the National Party.

Massey Distance Gaming Club

- Attached is the club's constitution, which is agreed to by the club's committee.
- Under Membership 3.1: Membership shall be open to all currently enrolled Massey University students wishing to join and willing to pay any membership fee, although final membership is at the discretion of the club. Further, 3.4: The club may restrict the committee members to belonging to a particular college or school and will have the final discretion regarding membership.
- The majority of their members belong to the club's Discord server. Discord usernames are whatever you want them to be, and a member chooses to put their pronouns on their profile. Reviewing a guick sample of online members, there are a variety of pronouns.

Hunting and Fishing Club

- The aims and goals of the Hunting and Fishing Club is to bring together like-minded individuals who are interested in hunting and fishing, remove costs associated with gear necessary for hunting and fishing trips and important health and safety equipment, and arrange or secure funding for members to participate in hunting and fishing trips.
- The funding they receive has always been directly related to hunting and fishing or creating social spaces for students who are interested in hunting and fishing.
- A Massey staff member has investigated the claims and complaints of the club's affiliations in Palmerston North. This is confidential information between Massey University and the people involved.
- The club has been told that they are to only host activities directly related to the aims and goals it outlines during affiliation, and any religious activity it wishes to engage in must first be approved by their campus' chaplains.
